- Business Units have "Super Users" to support their teams
- Users are confident and ready to take it forward
- IT Operations is ready to support the solution
- New processes are well structured and aligned with the organization
- Continues Training and Data Governance
- Operating budget in place (Business Units and IT)
- Technology is stable, safe and performing as expected
- Roles & Responsibilities well mapped and communicated



#### What we usually see...

- Key post go-live resources not available during the project
  - IT team not aligned with new technology or prepared to support the solution
    - ✤ Operations roles remain unfilled
    - ✤ Incomplete data into the system
      - Outdated technology
    - Operating budget not finalized
  - Resource procurement timeline misaligned with project deadlines
- Project team members transitioning to different roles (Change Champions or Super Users)

## Suggestions

- Utilize the strengths of each framework for yourself and your project.
- Prioritize People Change Management for post-implementation success.
- Ensure early IT ownership and engagement in project stages.
- Develop a robust Target Operating Model and Business Readiness Checklist.
- Emphasize Data Governance throughout the project lifecycle.
- Do not proceed without a clear Training Governance plan.
- Always talk about operating budget!
